What: INGRoup proudly announces the Annual Doctoral Consortium, to be held immediately before the INGRoup conference in St. Louis! The aim of the consortium is to support the development of the next generation of interdisciplinary group researchers.

Who: 25 current PhD students who are members of INGRoup. If you are not currently a member, now is a great time to join INGRoup at the reduced graduate student rate, so that you can qualify for our consortium.

When & Where: The consortium will be held on Thursday, July 20, 2017 on campus (agenda, location, and transportation details will be forwarded to confirmed participants prior to the consortium).

Interested? Apply now! Doctoral students at advanced stages of their degree programs will be given priority. Please submit the following items:

- (1) Your current CV
- (2) A letter of support from your PhD advisor explaining why you are at the right stage in your program to attend
- (3) We also have a limited number of spaces for a special luncheon program during the consortium. If you are interested in receiving feedback on a work-in-progress first author effort (e.g., dissertation, manuscript), you may submit a 5-page summary of your work in the area of groups or teams research. You will be put in a small group to briefly present your idea. Then you will receive feedback from a noted groups/teams scholar. Participation will be based on availability of expert scholars and is assigned on a first come, first serve basis.
